





SAFE PADDLING IN ONTARIO'S LAKE COUNTRY

SAFETY TIPS: Paddling conditions on the rivers, inland lakes and Georgian Bay are affected by natural processes, the seasons and continual change. This publication provides general information only and should not be regarded as a detailed guide of actual conditions you might encounter. Please remember that canoeing, kayaking and standup paddle boarding can be dangerous activities.

Since weather conditions can change quickly, make sure to bring appropriate clothing for dry and wet weather.

By law canoes and kayaks must be equipped with the following:

- Personal Flotation Device (PFD) or life jacket for everyone on board
- Buoyant throw line at least 15m (50ft) long
- Spare paddle, bailer or manual water pump
- Sound signaling device
- * Safety gear can be rented or purchased from local outfitters.

LITTER & FIRES: Please help preserve the natural beauty of these areas. Use established campsites only, put litter in proper receptacles and keep fires small and in approved areas. Take home what you bring in.

PRIVATE PROPERTY: There is private property along the shores of many of the listed routes. Please pull off on public shoreline or designated access points.



Orillia's Cultural Route city of Orillia



WATERWAY Lake Couchiching

DISTANCE 10km Loop

3-4 Hours

DIFFICULTY Easy

TYPE OF ROUTE Loop & Linear

Orillia's history is tied to the water and this route features cultural landmarks found along Lake Couchiching's shore. It features famous monuments and historical buildings like the statue of Samuel de Champlain and the Orillia Bandstand. The vibrant Couchiching Beach Park, connected to Downtown Orillia is on the grounds of the original village plot and industrial waterfront where steamboats carried lumber and passengers throughout the watershed along the Trent-Severn Waterway. Paddlers enter the water at the second beach in the park, travel between the breakwall and the Port of Orillia and then follow the shoreline. From the water you will see the historic Champlain Sailing Club and enter tranquil Old Brewery Bay. You will arrive at the Stephen Leacock Museum & Café, the summer home where the famous author was inspired to write Sunshine Sketches of a Little Town. Then continue along to Tudhope Memorial Park, a bronze statue of singer and poet Gordon Lightfoot, and a memorial to the sinking of the Edmund Fitzgerald can be found along the point, enter through Portage Bay. This route can be done in either direction and has the opportunity to connect with great walking and cycling trails.

WATERWAY Lake Couchiching, Narrows, Lake Simcoe

DISTANCE 13 km Loop

TIME 4-6 Hours

DIFFICULTY Intermediate/Advanced

TYPE OF ROUTE Loop

Paddle through Lakes Simcoe and Couchiching and visit a National Historic Site of Canada: the Mnjikaning Fish Weirs. Located just below the surface in the Narrows, which connects Lake Simcoe to Lake Couchiching, the weirs are an important site of gathering and healing for First Nations people. The word Mnjikaning is Ojibwe which translates to "fish fence" and the weirs are a system of wooden stakes used to catch fish entering Lake Couchiching. As paddlers travel Lake Couchiching they will pass some small islands. On main land you can connect with multi use trails and parks. There are picnic spots and beaches for swimming, providing an abundance of scenic natural landscapes and wildlife viewing along this route.



This route can also experience heavy boat traffic on the weekend, especially through the Narrows. Stand up paddle boarding is only recommended in the Bays at the beginning and ends of this route, and it is highly recommended to avoid the Narrows. Please respect and obey the rules of the waterway.

Lake Simcoe Shores township of Ramara



WATERWAY Lake Simcoe

DISTANCE 11.5 km One Way

TIME 4-6 Hours

DIFFICULTY Easy/Intermediate

TYPE OF ROUTE Linear

Launch at McRae Point Provincial Park and hug the shoreline of the sparkling waters of Lake Simcoe. Be sure to keep an eye out for herons, hawks and ospreys as they love to catch their next meal on this bountiful lake. Bring your gear and drop a line in the well known fishing hole of Lake Simcoe. You will pass the beautiful Mara Provincial Park and end your paddle at Lovely Day Park. All three of the parks include picnic locations, swimming and stunning views of the lake, the two provincial parks offer seasonal camping. You can paddle this route in either direction. Please note the operating dates for the provincial parks; Mara is mid May to Labour Day weekend and McRae Point is mid May to Thanksgiving weekend. 

Please respect and obey the rules of the waterway. If you are paddling late in the season, duck hunting is open at McRae Point after Thanksgiving.

Lake Couchiching Water Trail township of RAMARA



WATERWAY Lake Couchiching

DISTANCE 17 km Linear

TIME 6-7 hours

DIFFICULTY Easy/Intermediate

TYPE OF ROUTE Linear

Paddle the Lake Couchiching Water Trail an extension of the Trans Canada Trail and includes a 17 km connection to the land trail. This route will take you along the eastern shores of Lake Couchiching, enjoy the crystal-clear waters of this beautiful lake. This is also your connection to the Trent Severn Waterway where in the south you come in from Lake Simcoe and in the North the Severn River. There are a few launch point options depending on how long of a route you are looking for. Along this route, you will pass Fern Resort as well as many summer camp facilities, homes and cottages, please respect these private properties. This route can be done in a loop but it is recommended to complete it in a linear line along the shore.



Paddle North Couchiching township of severn



WATERWAY Lake Couchiching

DISTANCE 5 km Loop

TIME 1.5 - 3 Hours

DIFFICULTY Easy/Intermediate

TYPE OF ROUTE Loop

The North Lake Couchiching route is perfect for a shorter family outing and a great opportunity to tie in the use of Washago Centennial Park's facilities including a picnic area, playground and beach. On your paddle enjoy the crystal clear waters of Lake Couchiching amongst the small rock outcroppings and islands. You will leave from and return to the park, where you will pass by the Washago water tower in the distance, possibly see beautiful swans and ducks and enjoy a paddle that can connect to small inlets into other rivers. This route can be expanded by paddling further into Lake Couchiching or enjoy the peacefulness of connecting to the Severn River. The village of Washago is just a short distance away from this park and a perfect stop for refreshments.



Discover The Gentle Green TOWNSHIP OF RAMARA & SEVERN



WATERWAY Green River

DISTANCE 7-9 km Loop

TIME 2-3 Hours Out & Back

DIFFICULTY Easy

TYPE OF ROUTE Loop

The Green River is a true hidden gem in Ontario's Lake Country. The quiet waters are in the middle of nature where the feeling of remoteness is present. The river is named for its green colour and clear waters, and this is evident where it meets up with the Black River. Paddle this route where you will pass marsh areas with beaver lodges and beautiful birds and see the fish swim through the crystal clear waters. Just past Mill Island you will come to the Washago Grist Mill, originally built in 1873, currently used as a private residence; to the left of the mill is a small waterfall. To the other side of Mill Island you will find a town dock where you can connect to the quaint village of Washago, a perfect spot to grab a refreshment. You can continue your route up to the Northwest end of the river where you will find a small rapid that ends this portion of the river at a private property. If you are ambitious and want to extend your paddle, you can connect with the Black River and venture to Wasdell Falls or Black River Wilderness Route.



Black River Wilderness

TOWNSHIP OF RAMARA & RAMA FIRST NATION



WATERWAY Black River

DISTANCE 8 km Linear

 \Box 3-4 hours

DIFFICULTY Intermediate/Advanced

TYPE OF ROUTE Loop

The Black River is a synonym for serenity, this winding river takes you to remote sections where you feel as if you are kilometers away from civilization. This popular waterway has it all, from several small white-water sections which are popular among beginner white-water paddlers to peaceful paddling towards the village of Washago by connecting to the Green River. The river has a strong cultural and spiritual connection, the Mnjikaning Anishnaabeg used this river to travel South from Muskoka. This route is the perfect mix between a calm paddle, exciting whitewater sections, and cultural significance. Plan to stay over night at Black River Wilderness Park, or extend your paddle on the Black River or Green River. It is recommended because of the flow of the river to start at the park.










This route sees heavy spring runoff, and can become quite low during the summer to fall months. Due to a several rapids ranging from level 1 to 3 (depending on water level), this route is more suitable for intermediate to advanced paddlers. It is highly recommended to wear your safety gear.

Black River To Wasdell Falls township of ramara



WATERWAY Green & Black River

DISTANCE 8 km Loop

3-3.5 Hours

DIFFICULTY Easy-Intermediate

TYPE OF ROUTE Loop

The Black River is one of the most scenic routes in all of Ontario's Lake Country. It is a peaceful setting passing by some cottages and homes. Start your paddle off in the Green River and watch the colour of the water change as you connect with the Black River. Paddle toward Wasdell Falls, where you will see the first generating station constructed by the Hydro-Electric Power Commission in 1914. This is a great paddle in spring, summer or viewing the fall colours and connecting with nature. For a further paddle there is portage access at Wasdell Falls to the Severn River, or connect to the Green River into Washago.



Severn River To Wasdell Falls township of severn



WATERWAY Severn River

DISTANCE 7-22 km Linear or Loop

■ 8-9 Hours

DIFFICULTY Intermediate/advanced, depending on boat traffic and length

TYPE OF ROUTE Linear or Loop

Paddle the Severn River a section of the Trent Severn Waterway and experience the beauty of the waterways in Ontario's Lake Country. Plan to grab a snack at Lauderdale Point Marina before heading out. This paddle adventure takes you from the shores of Sparrow Lake to Lock 42 a great spot to stop for a break and to watch the boats pass by, admire the engineering involved in this national historic site. You can continue your paddle to Wasdell Falls a hydroelectric power dam created in 1914. For a longer paddle you can portage around Wasdell Falls to Black River. If a challenging but rewarding paddle is what you are looking for then look no further! This is recommended mid-week or during spring or fall seasons when the boat traffic is lower, which provides for a more relaxing paddle.



Sparrow Lake holds a vast variety of wildlife and is a paddler's dream for beginner and advanced paddlers alike. The lake is popular among many cottagers and recreational boaters and offers some of the best fun on the water in the region. Start your paddle at Lauderdale Point Marina and paddle north-east along the shores towards the mouth of the Kahshe River. From there continue your paddle north to Goose Rock to observe the wildlife inhabiting this small island. Once you have reached the northern part of the Lake move south west and see the island archipelago many of which are occupied by small cottages. Continue south through Duck Bay and back to Lauderdale Point Marina. For a longer paddle you can connect to the Severn River in the south and north. Once back on land explore some of the many trails surrounding the area. If you are looking for a relaxing and easy paddle, this is the perfect route for you.







The versatility of this route makes it a great paddle and a new experience for some. Enjoy the crystal clear waters of Georgian Bay from Matchedash Bay out to Green Island. Take in the rugged beauty of the rock cuts and your backdrop as you paddle around Green Island - you have entered the Georgian Bay 30,000 Islands National Park. For those more experienced, go a bit further and out into the open water of Georgian Bay but note that winds can blow up out of nowhere taking the waters from calm to extreme in the matter of minutes. Connect to the Coldwater River Route through the opposite end of Matchedash Bay.







TYPE OF ROUTE Loop or Linear

The Coldwater River starts just down the road from the heart of Coldwater where you can stop and pick up refreshments and other products prior to your paddle. This is a scenic and easy route that connects to the North River and Matchedash Bay with a number of different launch point options. There is wildlife galore along this river with many species of ducks and other birds and animals spotted along the way. See the wood duck boxes along the Coldwater River route and an osprey nest at the start of the North River route. If you are an angler, this is also a great opportunity to hook a steelhead or salmon. If you're up for a challenge, paddle out into the open waters of Georgian Bay, to Green Island another route available in this guide.



Bass Lake's shallow, clear waters are the perfect spot to learn how to paddle. The west shoreline of this route is undeveloped creating a sense of seclusion including a marsh area to see wildlife, while the northeastern part of the route allows for the opportunity to stop along the shoreline and walk to the nearby restaurant. There are various locations to access the lake, but the recommended launch is right in Bass Lake Provincial Park. Your admission to the park will allow you to use their included amenities. 
